- **Science Communication Workshop**

In case you have indicated your preference to participate in the Science Communication Workshop offered in collaboration with the Munich Science Communication Lab and the Deutsches Museum, please make sure to arrive at the following location on Tuesday, 5 December at 9 AM:

**S-Bahn:** The island on which the museum was built lies within walking distance between the S-Bahn stations "Isartor" (closer) or "Rosenheimerplatz."

**Subway (U-Bahn):** If you prefer a short (12-minute) walk along the Isar River, you can take the U-Bahn (U1 or U2) to the "Frauenhoferstr." Station and walk the "Erhardstr." downstream. You won't miss the building housing the Deutsches Museum to your right in front of the European Patent Office.

Due to construction work on the bridge connecting the Museum-Island to both riversides, bus and tramway connections to this location are irregular. Please, check the MVG-App for accurate live information about any connection to this venue.

- **Conference Dinner**

The Conference Dinner on Tuesday, 5 December, at 8:30 PM will take place in one of Munich's most traditional and iconic Beerhalls: the Löwenbräukeller.

Subway (U-Bahn): Station Stiglmaierplatz served by lines U1 and U2  
Tramway: Station Stiglmaierplatz served by lines 20 and 21

A 30-minute walk through Munich's Maxvorstadt, one of Munich's most livable neighbourhoods or a 15 bus ride to "Königsplatz" (Bus Line 100) separates the main venue from the conference dinner location.

## **Getting around in Munich**

- **Arrival by airplane (Munich Airport "Franz Joseph Strauß" / MUC)**

Munich's Airport (MUC) is well connected to the city centre and the conference venue by taxi, S-Bahn (Suburban rail) and bus. The signs in the terminals will guide you to your preferred means of transportation:

- **S-Bahn (suburban railway):** Lines S1 and S8 connect the terminals with the city centre. A single one-way ticket can be bought at the many Deutsche Bahn Ticket Vending Machines located in both terminals and the platforms for EUR 13. A group ticket (up to max. 5 adults) costs EUR 27.80. Make sure to validate your ticket before entering the train. Depending on the location of your hotel, you can alight at Munich Main Station (Hauptbahnhof) for connections with subway lines U1, U2, U4, and U5 or Marienplatz for connections with lines U3 & U6. The journey takes between 40-50 minutes to the city centre. To continue to the conference venue please change at Marienplatz and take either the U3 (Direction Moosach or Olympiazentrum) or U6 lines (Direction Garching Forschungszentrum/Fröttmaning) and get off at the station "Universität".
- **Taxi:** Follow the signs to the nearest taxi stand. Taxis in Germany are painted in pale yellow. The fare for a taxi ride to the city centre ranges between EUR 85-95.
- **Bus:** [The Lufthansa Express Bus](#) offers connections to Munich's Central Station (Hauptbahnhof) (45 minutes) and Munich Nordfriedhof (25 minutes) every 20 minutes. A single ticket costs EUR 11.50 (EUR 18.50 return for another day possible). The station Munich Nordfriedhof is connected to the subway line U6

(Direction Klinikum Großhadern), which will get you to the conference venue at the subway station “Universität”.

- **Arrival by train (Munich Central Station)**

Munich’s Central Station (Hauptbahnhof) is well-connected to the public transportation system. To get to the conference venue from here by subway, you will have to change either at subway station “Sendlinger Tor”, served by lines U1 & U2 or “Odeonsplatz”, served by lines U4 or U5 into lines U3 or U6 until you get to “Universität”. You can also take the 100 bus line and enjoy the quite scenic route through Munich’s city centre until you get to “Universität”.
